

LARGE MULTIPLES

There has been a net fall of 118 large multiple pharmacies.
LloydsPharmacy has divested more than 200 pharmacies
(after acquiring 281 Sainsbury's pharmacies in September 2016)
and Rowlands Pharmacy is selling 70 stores. Boots has proposed axing head office jobs but made no mention of pharmacy closures.

SMALL MULTIPLES

There has been a net increase of 92 small multiple pharmacies, with Jhoots acquiring the most among the 12 largest chains (by owner). A significant proportion of Norchem's increase is because sister companies were combined.

INDEPENDENTS

There has been a net drop of 26 independent pharmacies. Most contractors still own a single pharmacy; there has been a slight increase in the number of contractors who own three or four pharmacies.

Exemptions to NHS market entry for distance-selling pharmacies were first introduced in England in 2005, resulting in a steady rise in numbers in the following years. Distance-selling NHS pharmacies are not permitted in Scotland and Wales.
